The Loneliness Crisis

- On May 3rd, 2023, the US Surgeon General issued an official advisory warning regarding "the public health crisis of loneliness, isolation, and lack of connection in our country." Before the pandemic, nearly half of American adults were classified as lonely. Medically, "loneliness and isolation increase the risk for individuals to develop mental health challenges in their lives, and lacking connection can increase the risk for premature death to levels comparable to ______ daily."
- 2. The pandemic ______ withdrawal from the primary avenues of social connection.
 - a. Church attendance has dropped significantly. There are two positives, however. The beneficial pruning of dead branches (John 15:1-2). Gen Z and Gen Alpha (all those under age 27; reared out of church) have shown an increased interest in Christianity. However, they seek an authentic, active faith offering a real ______ to societal problems.
 - b. Membership, volunteering, and financial donations have all declined for ______ organizations.
 - c. Most alarming is the falling rates of marriage and childbirth. Nearly _____% of US adults are single. Next year the population of high school students in the US will peak, followed by continual decline for the next generation.
- 3. While there are legitimate and understandable causes (people can be exhausting, political/ideological divisiveness, societal ______, social media disintegrating social skills, constant "connection" overloads our sensory and processing abilities, etc.), social disengagement and isolation have profound negative mental, emotional, and physical effects.

- 2. Throughout the Scriptures, God affirms His special care for those who may not be married or parents. He is the "father to the fatherless, a defender of widows" (Psalm 68:5). The Apostle Paul was unmarried (1 Corinthians 7:8) and emphasized how unmarried men and women can devotedly serve the Lord (1 Corinthians 7:32-34). Philip's four unmarried daughters had the gift of _____ (Acts 21:9).
- 3. The first solution to loneliness is ______ with the Lord.

"The friendship of the Lord is for those who fear him, and he makes known to them his covenant...Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted. The troubles of my heart are enlarged; bring me out of my distresses. Consider my affliction and my trouble, and forgive all my sins." – Psalm 25:14,16-18 (ESV)

4. Through faith in Christ, God places us into His _____, the Church. The Church consists of congregations where fellow believers & those exploring faith can form friendships, provide care, & learn to love better.
